## 2 Minutes of the Meeting

**Present: Bob Fourer, Brady Hunsaker, Lou Hafer, Robin Lougee-Heimer, Matt Saltzman. A quorum was present.**

**The President was present and presiding. Meeting called to order at 10:13 AM.**

### 2.1 Approval of minutes for meetings on 2005 June 16, 2005 August 4, and 2005 October 25.

Motion to approve all three sets of minutes was adopted.

### 2.2 Official record of election results

The Secretary reported on results of the election for directors. Question as to whether the actual number of votes received should be reported publicly.

Brady Hunsaker moved that “We report the elected candidates and the total number of ballots cast in the public minutes, and that we retain records of all ballots until the completion of the next election of directors.” The motion was adopted.

In the election completed in November 2005, 14 ballots were cast out of 40 eligible voters. Elected members of the SLB are Bob Fourer and Robin Lougee-Heimer. Elected members of the TLC are Laci Ladanyi, Ted Ralphs, Francois Margot, and Kipp Martin.

Lou Hafer moved to close the nominations. The motion was adopted.

## 2.4 Would COIN-OR host projects that contain open-source software that uses an API to proprietary software?

This question was posed to a Board member at the INFORMS conference by a software vendor.

Comments that we already have code that links to proprietary solvers. Concerns that this sets a trend toward "locking-in" toward a particular product.

Other concerns about our requirement that COIN-OR should be the best place for the contribution. Some contributions we imagine would be better suited to a company's website.

A sense that this is hard to judge without a specific project in front of us.

Action item: Robin Lougee-Heimer will contact the software vendor about our policies and interest as well as some concerns about this issue.

Discussed various aspects of keeping technical reports.

Action item: Lou Hafer will contact Kevin Furman about his interest in setting this up.
